Teshuvah Preparation

ותשובה ותפלה וצדקה מעבירין את רע הגזרה

*“But Repentance Prayer and Righteous Giving
Temper Judgement’s Severe Decree”*

The process of *Teshuvah* (repentance) is a serious, lengthy and gradual one. During this holiday period, we engage in the first two levels of teshuvah: awareness of our wrongdoing and voicing our vows to change. The third level, the most vital and the one upon which the first two depend, is the fulfillment of our vows when challenged.

During these *Yamim HaNoraim* (Awesome Days), in addition to our communal and individual prayers, our feelings of fellowship and bonds to our history and destiny, we are challenged to actively and authentically confront ourselves, refine ourselves, and renew ourselves. As an aid in embracing this task, please use this Teshuvah Worksheet to help focus your thoughts and spirit upon the sacred task at hand.

TESHUVAH/REPENTANCE תשובה

RELATIONSHIPS:

- 1.) How am I part of the problem in the following relationship: my spouse/ significant other, my children, my parents, my siblings, my friends and my co-workers?
- 2.) How can I contribute to healing this relationship?
- 3.) How can I act on that contribution immediately? (seek that person out, ask for forgiveness, forgive insults and slights against you)

CARE OF THE BODY:

- 4.) How did I treat my body this past year?
- 5.) What can I do to improve my health and condition?

CARE OF THE MIND:

- 6.) How did I enrich my knowledge and thinking?
- 7.) How did I increase my openness and tolerance?

CARE OF THE SOUL:

- 8.) How did I care for/neglect my soul during this past year?
- 9.) What can I do to better care for my soul? (read books, attend classes, provide reflective time)

T'FILLAH/PRAYER תפילה

- 10.) What is the quality of my prayer life? Do I pray merely for answers, or seek to cultivate a relationship with God and the divinity in others?
- 11.) What can I do to enrich the quality of my prayer life? (attend worship more often, learn Hebrew, study the meaning and content of the prayers)

TZEDEKAH/RIGHTEOUS GIVING צדקה

- 12.) How much of my economic resources have I given to worthy/needed pursuits? What more can I give?
- 13.) How much of my time and efforts have I given to worthy/needed pursuits? What more can I give?
- 14.) What have I done to better the condition of the world's oppressed and impoverished? Who can I lobby, contact or influence to foster Tikkun Olam through the political process?

ULTIMATE QUESTION/CONFRONTATION:

When have I given up too easily, given in too quickly, and not made the most of my full, God-given potential in any pursuit? When have I rationalized when I should have realized?

Please embrace this worksheet honestly and genuinely. Let its answers speak to you from the heart of the self with the voice of God.

Back by popular demand, our Kulanu Service is designed so that parents can enjoy services together with their elementary and middle school age children. The service contains all the elements of the Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur morning services held in the main sanctuary, but with an emphasis on interaction so no one will have to sit still for long stretches of time. Rabbinic intern, Miriam Terlinchamp, will lead the service and teach the songs, themes and traditions of the High Holy Days morning service through a combination of prayer, music, drama, movement and meaningful creative activities. The Kulanu service will end at approximately the same time as services in the main sanctuary.

Kids will hear blasts from the shofar, sing songs, learn and have fun. For your convenience, our program concludes at the same time as those held in the main sanctuary. **An RSVP is required.**

Drop-ins will not be admitted. This is to ensure we have the appropriate number of worship materials as well as supervision for the children. **You can RSVP by calling Emily at (206) 315-7422 prior to September 18th.**

Child Care Registration

CHILDREN ARE INVITED TO ATTEND SERVICES. PARENTS MUST SUPERVISE AND MONITOR THEIR CHILDREN. Children and families are a vital part of who we are as a community at Temple De Hirsch Sinai. They represent our growth and our future. Because of this, it is our desire to see children attend services with their families. For those of you with children unable to sit through a normal two hour High Holy Days service we offer the following options:

KIDS' KEHILLAH & KULANU: Kulanu (at 10:00 a.m. on Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur morning in Seattle only) is for parents and children ages 5-11 to attend together. This participatory service contains the elements of the morning services in the main sanctuary. Our Kids' Kehillah service (at 10:00 a.m. on Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur morning in Bellevue only) is an interactive service for your children ages 6-9. **Kids' Kehillah services need your RSVP no later than September 18. Please call (206) 315-7422. We will not be able to accommodate drop-ins.**

FAMILY SERVICES, at 1:30 p.m. on Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur afternoons, provide a worship experience for children under 9 years old and their parents. This service is open to the public and is an excellent way for your friends and family who may not be Temple members to worship with you and your children at the High Holy Days. Feel free to invite them to our Family Services!

CHILD CARE; Ages 1 - 5, Yom Kippur Morning and Afternoon: \$22.50 per child per session provides full-time care for your toddler in an age appropriate and loving environment. **Due to regulations, childcare is available by reservation only and the location is not transferable. Drop-in childcare will not be available. Complete the registration form on page 15 and send with payment by Monday, September 25th. PLEASE NOTE CHILDCARE FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE.**

It is our hope that the available alternatives provide you and your family meaningful and convenient options to worship during the High Holy Days. Please be courteous of others by being aware of your child's ability to sit through services. Please remember that the above listed special age-appropriate services are offered in both our Seattle and Bellevue campuses. Our best wishes to you and your family for a healthy and happy new year.

Ticket Policy

Member Tickets - Non Transferable

One ticket for Rosh Hashana and one for Yom Kippur will be issued to each family whose membership is in good standing. Tickets are not required for the Family or Afternoon services. You may use your tickets at either Bellevue or Seattle. Seating will be on a first-come, first-choice basis. HIGH HOLY DAYS TICKETS ARE NOT TRANSFERABLE, and are valid only for the individuals whose names appear on the ticket.

Please make certain that your Annual Contribution, Capital Fund, school fees and other accounts are current. Exception to this policy is only by advance special arrangement with Larry Broder, Executive Director.

College Memberships

College memberships are presently available at no cost to full-time students. High Holy Days ticket privileges are included as part of the membership benefits. *For more information, call 206-323-8486 during business hours (9a.m. - 5 p.m. Monday - Friday).*

Non-Member Ticket Requests

All additional ticket requests will be processed on a space available basis. The fee for adult tickets is \$65 per service or \$225 for all four services. The cost for children (under 18 years old) is \$40 per service or \$125 for all four services. Though tickets are available to prospective Temple members and other unaffiliated members of the community, relatives or guests of Temple members will have priority in ticket processing.

Seattle Parking Instructions

This year, as always, High Holy Days parking will be at a premium. Please plan ahead when figuring your travel times and allow extra time to locate parking. We strongly advise car-pooling whenever possible.

In order to accommodate the maximum number of cars, there will be “Stacked Parking” in the Temple’s Seattle lots on the northeast and northwest corners of 16th and Union. If you park in one of Temple’s lots, you will not be able to leave until services are over.

The map on the following page shows the **Seattle** locations of the lots listed below.

- 1. Temple upper & lower lots**, stacked parking. *Available all services.*
- 2. Jewish Family Service (2 lots)**, north of E. Pine St. off of 16th Ave. West lot at JFS and East lot behind Madison Market across the street from JFS entrance. *Available all services.*
- 3. T.T. Minor Elementary**, off East Pike Street between 17th and 18th Ave. *Available for services except Yom Kippur.*
- 4. First A.M.E. Church**, “L” shaped lot off of East Madison and Pike Street between 14th and 15th Avenue, entrances on 14th and on East Madison. Please do not park in spaces marked “Reserved.” *Not available on Erev Rosh Hashana or Rosh Hashana. Available Kol Nidre and Yom Kippur.*

Handicapped Parking



Limited handicapped parking is available in front of the sanctuary on 16th Avenue. Vehicles without valid permits will be towed. This area will also be available as a passenger load and unload zone and will be reserved for emergency vehicles.



Bellevue Parking Instructions

High Holy Days always provide us with a real test of Temple cooperative spirit! We will have ushers and parking lot assistants there to help all our members. Our on-site lot holds 100 vehicles and our two off-site lots accommodate overflow.

Drivers may drop off their families at the Temple and park either in Temple's lot, or in one of two off-site parking lots. Either off-site location is within walking distance of our new facility.

SHUTTLE BUSES: Shuttles between Temple and the off-site lot will start their runs one hour prior to the beginning of services. Shuttles will return drivers to their vehicles starting immediately after services, and continue for one hour or until all drivers have returned to their vehicles.

HANDICAPPED PARKING: Much of our on-site parking lot will be reserved for handicapped drivers with valid handicapped driver permits.

OFF-SITE PARKING: Off-site parking has been arranged at a convenient location:

- **The Crossroads Bible Church:** (Primary off-site lot) located one and a half blocks to the East of our facility. Use parking stalls immediately located at the northwest entrance of the lot. **Available all services.**
- **PCL Building:** This lot is our secondary off-site lot. Park in rear lot only. Located 1 block before 156th. **Available for evening services only.**

ARRIVE EARLY: Please park first in the Temple lot, then when full, the Crossroads Bible Church lot. Our secondary lot (the PCL building rear lot) will be used as needed.

COVERED WAITING AREAS: Temple has erected covered waiting areas in both lots and a shuttle to both lots will be available.

NO PARKING ON RESIDENTIAL STREETS: Congregants are prohibited from parking on residential streets located near the western border of our property. The City of Bellevue WILL vigorously patrol and enforce regulations.

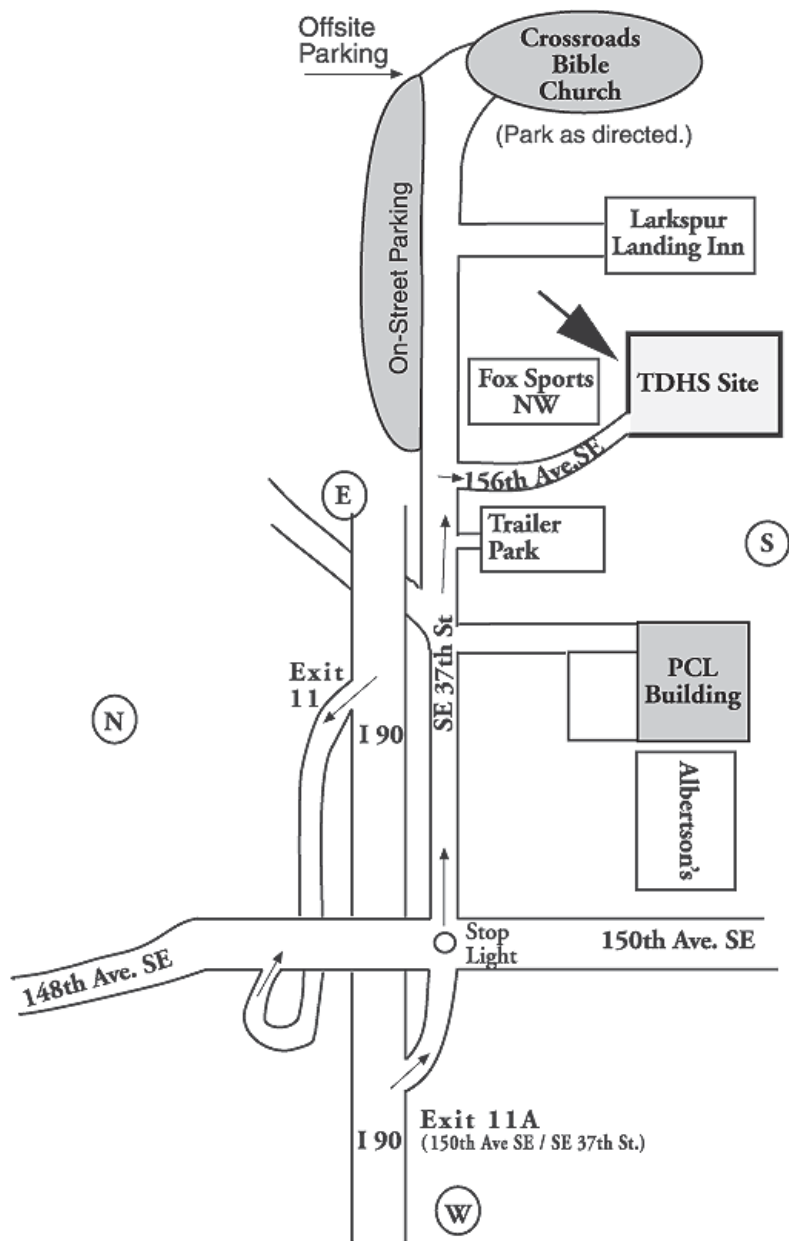
From Seattle/West:

1. Take I-90 eastbound to exit 11A (150th Ave. SE/SE 37th St.).
2. Bear right on exit to stoplight at intersection of 150th Ave. SE and SE 37th Street. You are on SE 37th St. at exit end.
3. Drive through light heading east on SE 37th St., passing Albertson's and the Motor Vehicle Emissions Testing Station.
4. Turn right on 156th Ave. SE just past Trailer Inn's RV Park to the top of the hill.

From East:

1. Take I-90 westbound to Exit 11 (150th Ave. SE).
2. Follow exit to 150th Ave. SE and cross over I-90 as you merge left on 150th Ave SE.
3. Turn left at the SE 37th St. stop light, heading east on SE 37th St. passing Albertson's and the Motor Vehicle Emissions Testing Station.
4. Turn right on 156th Ave. SE just past Trailer Inn's RV Park to the top of the hill.

SERVICE ETIQUETTE

Temple's goal is to provide our members with meaningful and spiritually uplifting services. All our members can play a part in helping achieve this goal – particularly at the High Holy Days. To help our rabbis and staff create a optimal environment for prayer and reflection we ask you to consider the following:

- **If you need to leave the sanctuary** during the service, please know that when you return you will be asked to wait to enter if the ark is open or if the rabbi is giving his/her sermon.
- **If you are in the Seattle or Bellevue foyer during services**, please be mindful that voices carry (more than you might realize) and that conversations should be kept low and far way from the sanctuary doors.
- **We welcome children worshipping with their families and ask all parents to monitor their child(ren)'s movements in the sanctuaries**, keep children from running in the aisles or walking up and down the stairs. Consider the Kids' Kehillah and Kulanu services (descriptions on pages 6 and 7) — child-friendly alternatives to main sanctuary services.
- **Please turn off your cellular phones and pagers** or switch them to their silent or vibrate mode before services.
- **Please be respectful of ushers' instructions.**
